ONLINE FRAUD

Over the past few months we have seen a constant issue that relates to ONLINE activity either in FRAUD or BLACKMAIL. And this usually happens on SOCIAL MEDIA sites / apps. The issues that we have had reported to us happen on the following sites :

- FACEBOOK MARKETPLACE
- INSTAGRAM
- SNAPCHAT
- FACEBOOK
- MESSENGER

When it comes to FACEBOOK MARKETPLACE , the issues relate to people selling items and not receiving the money and when they buy items they don't receive what they have purchased.

On the other sites , people have accepted friend requests / messages from people who they DO NOT know. Once they have accepted the request , that person instantly reaches out and starts a conversation building up trust and usually asks for PICTURES or MONEY. When PICTURES are sent , the person who has sent the pictures gets blackmailed to send some money or else the pictures will get sent to friends / family. And when MONEY is sent, the communication link is broken and the person who sent the money is BLOCKED.

KEEPING YOURSELF SAFE ONLINE

IT IS IMPORTANT TO KEEP YOURSELF AND YOUR FAMILY SAFE ONLINE.

Ways in which you can keep yourself safe online could include the following:

- FACEBOOK MARKETPLACE—use a protected payment transfer such as PAYPAL to either send or receive money.
- FACEBOOK MARKETPLACE—check out the buyer / sellers profile and see what other people say about that person
- FACEBOOK MARKETPLACE—never send or hand over your item that your selling without receiving payment.
- NEVER accept messages or friend requests from people you don't know
- DON'T send images that could be used against you

WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of Neighbours being loud till 0400— Reporting Person advised to contact their housing officer as both the reporting person and person causing issue are with the same housing association. PCSO made aware and will work with GREAT PLACES with this
- Report of SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY from an unknown BROADBAND ENGINEER trying to gain access to property without an APPOINTMENT—PCSO attended for reassurance and contacted company and the company who they do work for to confirm that this was legit. Advised REPORTING PERSON to make an official complaint to their supplier in regards to the attitude of engineer
- Report of 3 MALES fighting by the TRAFFIC LIGHTS on LONDON ROAD—RESPONSE PCS dispatched—SEARCH MADE NO TRACE of males

LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Neighbour dispute in regards to joint access gate.—PC / PSCO attended to be aware of the issue, WEAVER VALE notified.
- Report of 4 male youths riding on OFF ROAD BIKES near LEFTWICH COMMUNITY CENTRE—COMMUNITY TEAM made aware and PATROLS to be conducted
- 2 x Reports of 2 male youths riding on OFF ROAD BIKES along CLIFTON DRIVE—COMMUNITY TEAM made aware to add onto PATROL PLAN
- Report of youths playing near reporting persons address and then accessing their garden and when asked to leave , reporting person receives verbal abuse—PCSO made aware and is to attend for reassurance and to see if youths can be identified
- Report of a unknown MALE and FEMALE knocking on door at 0300 which has been caught on RING DOOR CAM—RESPONSE PCS spoke to REPORTING PERSON in which the issue was a case of two people getting the wrong address as they were attending a friends address which was nearby
- Report of a unknown male caught on CCTV with a weapon—RESPONSE PCS attended and there was no weapon as it was something else that was misconstrued as a weapon
- Report of a neighbour shouting abuse at another neighbour—PCSO attended for reassurance and there had been no further issues , REPORTING PERSON just wanted issue logged incase of further issues
- Report of a neighbour shouting at REPORTING PERSONS children—COMMUNITY TEAM are aware of this NEIGHBOUR DISPUTE and are working with partner agencies to resolve this
- Report of MALES possibly smoking CANNABIS and starting fights outside THE WOODPECKER—RESPONSE PCS dispatched , all males STOP SEARCHED , males being just LOUD and asked to move on
- Ongoing NEIGHBOUR DISPUTE in relation to NOISE. Both parties spoken to by PC / PCSO and advice given , and this issue is being monitored.
- Report of an issue with a FEMALE entering and not leaving REPORTING PERSONS address—RESPONSE PCS attended and FEMALE arrested
- Report of ongoing NEIGHBOUR ISSUE in which photos were taken without consent of the other party.—RESPONSE PCs assigned this issue and is looking into this , alongside COMMUNITY TEAM
- Counter report due to the above report— RESPONSE PC assigned and is looking into this =, alongside the COMMUNITY TEAM
- Report of a group of MALES / FEMALES throwing items at window and banging on door—RESPONSE PCS attended , spoke to both REPORTING PERSON and the group which stemmed from an earlier argument

THEFT

- * Vehicle broken into—RESPONSE PCS contacted VICTIM and issue crimed

KINGSMEAD

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report of issues with bench placed by PARISH COUNCIL as it attracts teenagers who litter and are loud till late at night. Report also included that the previous night teenagers were loud till 2330- PCSO is aware of the issue and is working with PARISH COUNCIL and HOUSE to HOUSE conducted in area to see if this is an ongoing issue
- Report of a ROAD RAGE issue between two vehicles. Both registration plates taken down and passed to RESPONSE PATROLS
- Report of youths harassing neighbour—RESPONSE PCS dispatched , issue relates to neighbour dispute which included a person being arrested
- Report of a VULNERABLE MALE being verbally attacked by youths—PC / PCSO attended for reassurance—NO CCTV so youths can not be identified
- Report of verbal abuse being given to REPORTING PERSON from a neighbour.—RESPONSE PCS arranged scheduled appointment with REPORTING PERSON who did not attend.
- Report of an ELDERLY MALE being knocked off his scooter by youths—PCSO to conduct REASSURANCE VISIT and to see if CCTV in area to see if youths can be identified

DAVENHAM

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report of verbal abuse from builder in regards to issue with shared driveway.— PCSO attended for reassurance, building work had been completed so issue resolved.
- Report of youths shouting on BUTCHERS STILE—RESPONSE PCS dispatched and youths spoken to and left area
- Report of youths drinking around the LABURNUM ROAD PLAY AREA—RESPONSE PCS dispatched and attended area , youths ran away. PCSO made aware and will see if CCTV can be obtained to identify anyone
- Report of dogs being off their lead and knocking down another dog walker—PCSO made aware of issue and will be in contact with REPORTING PERSON.
- Report of a MALE attending suspiciously in a CAR—PCSO tried to get in touch with REPORTING PERSON but no contact as of yet
- Report of a MALE sleeping rough on BUTCHERS STILE—RESPONSE PCS attended , MALE identified and moved on
- Report of threatening messages being received—PCSO got in touch with REPORTING PERSON , reassurance given and there were no further issues that occurred
- Report of a Neighbour shouting abuse to REPORTING PERSON whilst they were dealing with a VULNERABLE friend—PCSO got in touch with reporting person for reassurance . No ID for the suspect but patrols will continue and if person is identified then they will be spoken to
- Report of threatening messages that were received from a PARTNER EX—RESPONSE PCS spoke to REPORTING PERSON who just would like the issue logged
- Report of a threatening letter being received from a NEIGHBOUR– PCSO attended and spoke to REPORTING PERSON. Letter was seen by PCSO and was not threatening , but reporting person would like the person who sent it to be spoken to , in which PCSO will be doing at the start of SEPT.

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Vehicle left 1/2 on pavement and 1/2 on HARTFORD ROAD , been there for approx 10 days—PCSO patrolled area and vehicle was not sighted

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- 2x Reports of a MALE being aggressive and shouting abuse at customers at local businesses—REPOSE PCS attended and male ARRESTED. PCSO conducted reassurance checks and patrols conducted and being conducted for possible further sightings of the male
- Report of possible harassment due to malicious communication—REPOSE PCS are aware of the issue and is being looked into , alongside the COMMUNITY TEAM , no malicious communication

THEFT

- * Theft of a trailer—CRIMED and PCSO to call for reassurance and possible further information

If you are affected by ASB, then please report it, so that we can look into it.



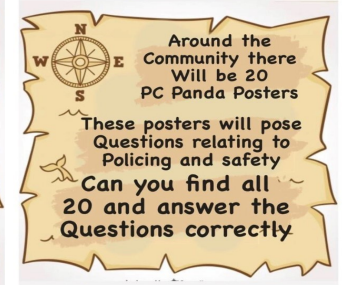
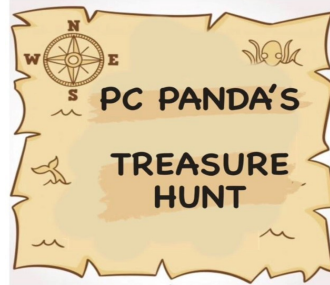
You Say - Speeding is an issue on MONARCH DRIVE (KINGSMEAD)

--- PATROL UPDATE ---

Last Night PCSO LEE conducted Patrols around the CLIFTON DRIVE area in LEFTWICH due to reports of ASB (ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR) and possible DRUGS

Last Night there was a group of males in the same location / time as reports suggested, therefore STOP CHECKS were requested.

PC LOCK attended the scene and STOP CHECKS completed, which the youths fully co-operated with (after being explained why these were happening)

These searches proved NEGATIVE and there was no cause for concern.

Pcso LEE is now outside KINGSMEAD SCHOOL till 1230 with the BIKE MARKING EVENT.

SAFETY ONLINE—Keeping your family / young ones safe online.

GOOGLE FAMILY LINK

With Family Link, you decide what's best for your family. Easy to use tools allow you to understand how your child is spending on their device, share location, manage privacy settings and more.



You can establish digital ground rules by setting screen limit times. Find the screen time that works best for your young ones. The app lets you set downtime for their device and time limits for app, so you can help your young ones find a healthy balance.

You can approve or even block apps your young ones have access to or even download. It also allows you to guide them to age appropriate content on popular sites such as YOUTUBE.

You can manage and make your child's account more secure, through permissions management. You can view and manage permissions for websites and extensions accessed through Chrome as well as other apps that have been downloaded to their device. Secure their account, as the app allows you to manage your young ones account and data settings. As a parent you can help change or even reset a password if they forget it, edit personal information or even delete account.

With GOOGLE LINK you can always stay connected on the go and locate your young ones on one map (as long as they are carrying their device)
