## YOUTHS / KNIFES / SOCIAL MEDIA

Over the past couple of weeks we have been alerted to issues that involve Youths being pictured with KNIVES on SOCIAL MEDIA. Within the community, during MARCH there had been two incidents involving images being shared on SNAP CHAT where youths are holding knives.

Both of these issues have been actioned, which has lead to these youths being Stop Checked if seen in public areas.

Knife Crime is a serious issue within the UK and this is being addressed due to these past two issues.

When it comes to knives, at NORTHWICH POLICE STATION we do have a KNIFE SURRENDER BIN in which ,if anyone has discovered a knife or has one to dispose of, it can be placed into this BIN. The surrender bin can be requested (which happened recently in MOULTON due to a member of public discovering a knife in their premises) and is taken to knife sweep areas.

If you discover a knife or have one to dispose off then please call down to NORTHWICH POLICE STATION or contact 101 or your officers.

In terms of SOCIAL MEDIA we do ask that Parents keep their children protected by ensuring that they know of issues that could be happening on SOCIAL MEDIA. To have a communication link with your child to ensure that if there is any issues like this, then they can talk to you about this and then therefore you can contact us.



When it comes to SOCIAL MEDIA if you hear of any issues with KNIVES being shown or shared , please notify us by calling 101 or you can report

anonymously by CRIME STOPPERS on 0800 555 111.

## WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

### ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of an assault within a public house— **RESPONSE are investigating , no PCSO reassurance visit completed as reporting person wants to remain anonymous**

## LEFTWICH

### ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report in regards to threats being made from a neighbour—**PCSO LEE to call for reassurance**
- Report of concern for a pupil who hasn't arrived at school , which could be a follow up of an incident that happened the previous night—**RESPONSE have contacted the family of the pupil and there is no cause for concern**
- Report of possible child neglect—**RESPONSE dispatched and completed a welfare check , child is ok and there is no causes for concern in regards to child neglect.**
- Report of an ongoing neighbor dispute which now is affecting the reporting persons workplace— **PCSO is aware of the issue and will be looking into this**
- Report to possible harassment as a former friend is spreading rumors about the reporting person— **PCSO to call for reassurance**
- Report of 2 guests being rude and aggressive and not leaving the location when asked to do so.— **PCSO ROBERTSON to call for reassurance**
- Report of threatening calls being received constantly—**PCSO Robertson to call**

## THEFT

- Report that a white wicker chair has been stolen by a male who leaned over and took it—**CRIMED**
- Report of a Bike being taken from Reporting Persons driveway, CCTV is available— **Crimed and PCSO ROBERTSON to call to check CCTV to see if person can be identified**

## KINGSMEAD

### ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report of a Neighbour being rude and aggressive and shouting threats— **Ongoing neighbour issue which PCSO ROBERTSON is aware of. PCSO ROBERTSON to call round for reassurance**
- Report of threats and gloating behavior in regards to a previous incident—**PC LOCK dealt with the previous incident and PCSO ROBERTSON to call**

## DAVENHAM

### ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of youths on scaffolding that has been placed up. When confronted the youths ran off and kicked the neighbours door—**PCSO has tried to called for reassurance**
- Report of ASB issues on BUTCHERS STILE by youths screaming and shouting— **PCSO ROBERTSON to look at CCTV and if there is anything of notice it will be looked at**

## MOULTON

### ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report of threatening messages being sent from an ex colleague— **RESPONSE officers attended address due to a pre arranged appointment—PCSO also called for further reassurance**
- Report made by a third party that messages were being sent in a group chat about hurting themselves—**RESPONSE dispatched and attended the person who sent the messages. The messages were sent to wind other up as they were getting frustrated. They realize that it was a silly message to send to others**
- 2x Reports of suspicious activity in relation to a new neighbour—**Community police (PCSO ROBERTSON / PC LOCK) are fully aware of this issue and are looking into this.**
- Report of males causing issues in the UNDERPASS as reporting persons children were walking home from school.—**PCSO to call for reassurance**

## BOSTOCK

### CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of a broken down vehicle which is causing an obstruction in road—**RESPONSE dispatched and SEARCH MADE NO TRACE for the vehicle**
- Report of an issue where two people got access to a secure building— **PCSO to call for REASSURANCE**

The community officers provide safeguarding advice which in the past couple of months included :



- FRAUD— not to provide details to anyone when they contact you. To hang the phone up and then contact the company / bank (you calling them) to ensure that if it was a legitimate call or not
- PROVIDING INTEL—if there were issues within the community to keep a regular contact with officers so that they can build a picture up of the issue and deal appropriately.

Along with safeguarding advice they also provided updates to previously mentioned issues and spoke about any new concerns that they may have had.

## MORE ACTION WITHIN THE COMMUNITY

### NURSERY VISIT—MOULTON

On the 21st March, PCSO ROBERTSON along with PCSO DONNELLY attended MOULTON PRE SCHOOL.

The children were able to try on different types of Uniform that PCSO's and PC's wear.

Then after that see the POLICE CAR, where they were allowed to go into the police car, turn on the lights and then the sirens.

So if you heard sirens a lot around MOULTON on the 21st, that is the reason why.

After this a special visit from PC PANDA was arranged.



### BUTCHERS STILE

Due to reports of Anti Social Behaviour, BUTCHERS STILE in DAVENHAM is on PCSO ROBERTSONS Patrol Plan. On the 15th March PCSO ROBERTSON was conducting a Patrol of the community which included BUTCHERS STILE. When in the areas 3 Teenagers (2 males and 1 female) caught his attention. These Teenagers were acting suspiciously by walking down residents alleyways towards BUTCHERS STILE. After seeing PCSO ROBERTSON they suddenly turned around. And then they were seen walking down another alleyway to BUTCHERS STILE. PCSO ROBERTSON approached them to make enquiries on their behaviour, in which they all were not engaging with PCSO ROBERTSON. Shouting abuse and not taking the issue seriously

by stating "WE ARE ALLOWED TO WALK WHERE WE WANT, MY GRANDMA LIVES HERE"

With PCSO ROBERTSON trying to explain the issues that are occurring in the location (ASB) which is the reason why enquires were being made.

All 3 again laughed it off and started to walk away, ignoring PCSO ROBERTSONS requests. With this RESPONSE OFFICERS were alerted.

All 3 ran off when out of sight from PCSO ROBERTSON and splitting up. PCSO ROBERTSON did eventually get details of one male and after being checked, he was given Strong words of advice to not be in the area at this time of night especially when he was NOT LOCAL and to make his way to the location he stated he was heading to.

RESPONSE officers attended and a search around the location was made, including LABURNUM ROAD and all areas where clear, so therefore the teenagers had left the area.



## KINGSMEAD MINI POLICE—MARCH

At the start of the month, the MINI POLICE started the PARKING PROMISE. This was introduced to the issues and reports that we had received over parking obstructions which were occurring in the surrounding area of KINGSMEAD PRIMARY.

This included :

MONARCH DRIVE , DUKES WAY , REGAL CLOSE , BUCKINGHAM DRIVE, CASTLEMEAD WALK and REGENY WAY.

The obstructions that were occurring were :

- Parking on Bends
- Parking over footpath crossings
- Parking on the double yellow lines
- Parking across Residents driveways

The Patrols were conducted everyday at pick up times and all areas where covered.

The MINI POLICE designed tickets that were issued to Good Parking and bad Parking



The MINI POLICE witnessed 16 Obstructions which therefore were issued BAD PARKING TICKETS. This was the first of many parking promise patrols

## A VISIT TO SIR JOHN DEANES COLLEGE
