ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB)

Anti-Social Behaviour is on the rise within the community. Over the past few months we have issues with youths causing issues in all areas of the community :



LEFTWICH—youths causing damage to OLD HALL ROAD PLAY AREA equipment

KINGSMEAD—youths setting fire to areas within POORS WOODS and bins

DAVENHAM—Knock and run incidents which are still being looked into by PCSO ROBERTSON / PC LOCK—unfortunately CCTV that has been obtained , identification can not be obtained as of yet.

- Youths causing damage to the play area in LABURNUM ROAD

MOULTON—Knock and run incidents which PCSO ROBERTSON and PC LOCK have obtained and looking into identifying those involved.

BUT NOT ALL OF THESE ARE GETTING OFFICIALLY REPORTED TO 101

AS DID YOU KNOW , POLICE CAN NOT USE CCTV TO IDENTIFY THOSE INVOLVED UNLESS THERE IS AN OFFICAL REPORT.

So please if there are issues with ASB please report them to 101 so that CCTV can be looking at, and then taken to our contacts within schools to try and identify those involved.

WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of someone injuring themselves and cutting themselves— **Injured person was being dealt with AMBULANCE**
- 2x reports—Ongoing reports of suspicious behaviour of a neighbour bringing FUEL back and storing it— **PCSO has contacted landlord , WEAVER VALE in regards to this. They have spoken to tenant and update given to PCSO who has passed this to the reporting person**
- 3x Reports of a Motorbike user riding the bike dangerously—**RESPONSE officers stopped the driver and given words of advice—breath test and drug test all come out CLEAR—PCSO will update Reporting person**
- Concerns about neighbours activity and welfare—**Reporting person spoke to PCSO in regards to this and INTEL as been logged**

* Report of vehicles blocking footpath in the area surrounding VERDIN HOUSE— **This is a PRIVATE CAR PARK so it is not a POLICE MATTER**

LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report of a neighbour being shouted and verbally threatened at by her neighbour.—**RESPONSE dispatched and safeguarding advice given. PCSO will link in with WEAVER VALE in regards to this.**
- 9 x Reports of an offroad Bike being rode around the LEFTWICH ESTATE—**PCSO is gathering intel in regards to this to identify the person , so we can issue a SECTION 59 / or even seize the bike—UPDATE—person involved has been warned in relation to having bike seized**
- Report of a neighbour causing a general disturbance due to noise and possible smoking cannabis—**Safeguarding advice given in relation to noise and INTEL placed in about the cannabis. PCSO ROBERTSON spoke to reporting person and advised any further info to let him know.**
- Report of possible damage to a padlock that could have been caused by people that reporting person knows off, but no evidence—**PCSO to call for reassurance**
- Concern for neighbours welfare as they have just returned home from hospital— **VPA has been submitted and PCSO to call for reassurance**
- 2 x Reports of a further issue related to an ongoing neighbour issue—**PCSO ROBERTSON / PC LOCK have attended both parties and there is no proof of the issues that they are reporting to police. So therefore advice given to both parties**
- Report of youths setting fire to playground equipment—**PCSO to see if there is any CCTV coverage and to speak to Reporting person**

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Report of a vehicle being parked on the edge of PRIORY AVE next the to the junction of LONDON ROAD—**PCSO has placed this area back on patrol plan**

KINGSMEAD

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of a daughter contacting someone who they shouldn't be through social media—**RESPONSE contacted reporting person along with daughter and safeguarding advice given—PCSO will contact reporting person for reassurance**
- Report of a woman in a dressing gown walking a dog and reporting person quite concerned about her—**RESPONSE dispatched and there was SEARCH MADE NO TRACE**
- Reports of a neighbour threatening another neighbour after having words with their son in regards to coming onto his driveway.—**SAFEGUARDING advice given—PCSO to call for reassurance**
- Report of concern over daughter who is being abusive—**PCSO to call for reassurance**
- Report of youths causing damage to a bin - **CRIMED—PCSO to call for further info to see if there is any CCTV**

THEFT

- Report of waste oil being stolen from the KINGFISHER Pub—**Has been crimed**

DAVENHAM

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of possible ASB being caused by a large group of youths on LABURNUM PARK—**RESPONSE dispatched and spoke to youths who were all polite and just playing games, field was being used by youths and it was 18:00hrs**
- Report of an issue with someone who lives in the area , causing issues and intimidating behaviour for reporting person—**Has been passed to RESPONSE officers to look into. PCSO will call for reassurance**
- Report of a suspicious vehicle that makes a regular appearance at night in reporting persons location—**RESPONSE dispatched and spoke to the driver of the vehicle—no cause for concern**
- Report of a large number of youths KNOCKING AND RUNNING from residents addresses—**CCTV has been captured of a large group doing something similar in another area , PCSO ROBERTSON will be trying to obtain identity of the youths involved. UPDATE—School can not identify any of the youths. There is a possibility of more CCTV being obtained that could help identify**
- Report of a male shining torchs and intimidating behaviour towards Reporting person—**PCSO ROBERTSON / PC LOCK to look into**

MOULTON

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of youths trying to set fire in the park opposite—**PCSO will call for reassurance to see if these youths are known or if there is CCTV**
- Report of a Male who, due to illness didn't know where he was—**RESPONSE officers found out his home address and spoke to wife, so male was taken home**
- Report of unknown males knocking on reporting persons door late at night— **PCSO to call for reassurance**

In May it was attended by PCSO ROBERTSON and there were many residents who came down and spoke with him about issue and concerns they had , which PCSO ROBERTSON is looking into at the moment.



ANOTHER DAY , ANOTHER LUNCH -

The Davenham lunches are now a regular event for the community police to attend. These lunches are held by DAVENHAM PARISH COUNCIL for the elderly and vulnerable within the community. This past month PCSO ROBERTSON attended and spoke about the issues with the ASB that recently occurred (Knock and Run) and provided everyone that attended the new FRAUD SAFEGUARDING BOOK.

RESIDENTS HELP WITH IDENTIFYING YOUTH

Within MAY there were reports in LEFTWICH in regards to a youth who was using an OFFROAD BIKE. Driving it in a dangerous manner (speeding) up and down CLIFTON DRIVE. PC LOCK and PCSO ROBERTSON along with RESPONSE were conducting patrols around the area at the times that mentioned within the reports , but the bike was never seen. However residents came forward and provided witness statements to identify who was causing the issue. With this , they were warned that if they were seen ON THAT BIKE or ANY OTHER BIKE , the bike that they were on WOULD BE SEIZED and possibly DESTROYED

LOCAL ELECTIONS WENT WITH A HITCH

PCSO ROBERTSON and PCSO DONNELLEY (Hartford and Greenbank) attended all stations listed above to provide reassurance and see if there were any issues that arose. Please to say there was no issues through out the day.

UPDATE WITH PCSO ROBERTSON

Back at the start of APRIL , PCSO ROBERTSON was asked to move over to become the NORTHWICH TOWN CENTRE PCSO.

After some consideration it was approved that he would become the TOWN CENTRE PCSO in MAY and continue his work with the KINGSMEAD MINI POLICE. However due to changes within the community police team, PCSO ROBERTSON requested to not only continue his work with the MINI POLICE but also his work within the community.

Therefore it was approved that PCSO ROBERTSON would become one of the 2 TOWN CENTRE PCSOS and still be the DAVENHAM AND MOULTON PCSO.

So with that PCSO ROBERTSON is now the DAVENHAM AND MOULTON / TOWN CENTRE PCSO , so at the current moment in time along with completing his current commitments within the community he is currently incorporating the TOWN CENTRE into his patrol plan. So with this for the next couple of weeks he may not be patrolling certain areas , like he use to. But please be assured once he has settled into his new role and developed a new way of working , patrols will recommence.
