Youths given Community Resolutions and completed Community work due to ASB issues

Back in September there was a number of issues that involved youths causing ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB) issues within KINGSMEAD and LEFTWICH.

These issues involved:

- shouting abuse at residents
- Threatening behaviour
- Knock and run incidents
- Shouting racial abuse at residents

All of the above were caught on CCTV and was provided to PCSO ROBERTSON. With this and the help from schools from around the community, all of the youths were identified.

Due to the victims request and with support from parents of those who were involved, all youths were spoken to. Those who weren't directly involved in the above and were just within the group were spoken to and advised of the issues they caused. Those who were directly involved were given COMMUNITY RESOLUTIONS.

WHAT IS A COMMUNITY RESOLUTION ?

A Community Resolution is a warning that is given out to anyone who has NOT received one before. It does not affect anything (like being arrested and having a criminal record does) and is only on the local record (so other local officers know if they have a Community Resolution or not). And if they person is caught doing the same offence again , they WILL BE arrested.

All of victims didn't want to criminalise those involved, in which a Community Resolution was ideal for these issues.

With a Community Resolution they also have to do something for those who are affected. And in these issues :

- Apology letters were written to the victims
- Flowers were bought and given together with public apologies
- Litter picks within the community was completed.

If there is any issues with ASB within the community , then please report these in, as with CCTV we can catch the ones who are causing the issues

SAFEGUARDING ADVICE


Over the past week there has been a number of reports regard Vehicles being stolen from owners driveways, within the MOULTON , KINGSMEAD and HART-FORD areas.

In all incidents the Vehicle was taken overnight, the vehicle was a keyless entry vehicle and the owner still had the keys.

We want to make everyone aware of this issue to help protect no more issues like this occur.

Here are some ways to keep your keyless car safe :

- STORE KEYS AWAY FROM THE CAR : When you're at home, keep your keys and spare keys away from your car, doors and windows.
- USE A SIGNAL - BLOCKING POUCH : Store your keys in a Faraday bag or other signal - blocking pouch to prevent thieves from intercepting the between your car and key
- TURN OFF WIRELESS SIGNALS : When you're not using your key fob, turn off its wireless signals
- USE A STEERING WHEEL LOCK OR CAR ALARM: Use a steering wheel lock or car alarm to protect your car
- PARK IN A GARAGE: If you have a garage, park your car there overnight.
- KEEP KEY FOB AWAY FROM THE FRONT DOOR: Keep your key fob away from your front door to prevent thieves from a getting a signal from it

Cars with keyless entry unlock automatically when the key comes within a short-range distance of the car.

The theft, also known as 'relay theft', occurs when a device is used to fool the car into thinking the key is close by; this unlocks the car and allows the ignition to be started.

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

Report in regards to a DOG BITE—Reporting person asked to stroke the dog walkers dog ,went down to stroke them and the dog bit her finger then jumped on her and pierced her skin— **ASB call back completed by PCSO GILLET and safeguarding advice given. PCSO ROBERTSON to call the reporting person for reassurance**

Report in regards to a FLASHING LIGHT near the ROWING CLUB which has never been seen before—**PCSO ROBERTSON to contact Reporting person**

Further reports of a suspicious behaviour of neighbour as pouring Diesel into vehicle.—**PCSO ROBERTSON is aware and has spoken with Reporting person in past , WEAVER VALE are aware of this and if there is anything in terms of evidence reporting person can provide of a crime being committed it will be looked into**

Report of a disturbance coming from an apartment above reporting persons address—**RESPONSE officers dispatched. No noise heard and no damage, as reporting person does not know which apartment it is coming from and due to the time it is not necessary to wake people up**

Second report of neighbour pouring DIESEL into a vehicle—**PCSO ROBERTSON is aware and will contact WEAVER VALE in regards to this as report suggests fuel being stored in shed,**

LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

Report in regards to a possible ABANDONED VEHICLE— **details have been passed to PCSO ROBERTSON and will check this vehicle out**

Report in regards to a male 'LEERING OVER' reporting persons daughter and making suggestive noises— **This has been inputted as INTEL and PCSO ROBERTSON to call for reassurance**

Report in regards to concern with neighbour as not been seen for 3 days—**No officers available and no reporting persons address for PCSO ROBERTSON to call round**

Report in regards to a male being STABBED— **the suspect has been named and PCSO ROBERTSON has supplied details of where the suspect is living therefore RESPONSE OFFICERS are on arrest attempts for the suspect**

Report of a PARENT attending LEFTWICH HIGH SCHOOL and being aggressive to staff—**RESPONSE officers to look into this**

Report of a neighbour burning wood in the back garden— **the fire is contained and there is no legal issue with people burning wood in their own garden (as long as its contained) this is a council issue.**

Report of a male approaching letterbox of reporting persons property at 1.15am which has been caught on ring door camera—**PCSO ROBERTSON has been alerted to this and will attend and review the footage.**

Report of two children using electric scooters at speed on a road—**this has been passed over to the PCSO to look into. PCSO ROBERTSON to call round to reporting persons address to get more information.**

Report of a MALE stood in the road (LONDON ROAD). Reporting person has asked if he is ok and he has replied that he is—**No officers available**

Report of 10 MALES attending reporting persons address and tried to gain access into reporting persons work van as he has forgotten to lock the vehicle—**RESPONSE officers dispatched—No males or vehicle matching description that these males got back into , in the area. Vehicle was checked by Reporting person and nothing has been taken. No CCTV footage.**

Report over concern over neighbour due to dog constantly barking and that the neighbour is intoxicated.— **Report also states that the intoxicated person has their partner there as well, no deployment of officers due to partner being present**

Report of a MALE throwing items and shouting abuse at reporting person—**RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched , argument involving drink and a disagreement**

Fire started by youths in wooded area—**FIRE has attended and has put the fire out**

KINGSMEAD

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

Report in regards to REPORTING PERSON being asked to spend time with a MALE. REPORTING PERSON called the male to say she was on her way (NO ANSWER) When arrived at his home, he was not at home so tried to call him again (NO ANSWER) - **No deployment due to not being a police matter**

Report over concern for child not returning home, child with father but Reporting person would like police to attend to take him home—**Not a police matter , reporting person has been advised to use their parenting skills to persuade him to return home and social services number provided.**

Report of threats being made to youths from a male, outside of TESCO—**PCSO ROBERTSON will call reporting person for more information and will attend TESCO to see if there is CCTV images of the male.**

Report of a Vehicle being taken from a driveway—**CRIMED**

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

Report of a road sign partially in the road on REGENCY WAY — **HIGHWAYS have been alerted**

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

Report of a possible suspicious vehicle with two males stopping and looking at peoples driveways—**INTEL has been logged with details reporting person has provided. PCSO ROBERTSON to call round for reassurance.**

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

Report of a TREE coming down onto CHURCH ROAD due to bad weather— **ROAD CLOSED by officers whilst tree was removed**

THEFT OF A MOTOR VEHICLE

Report of a TRAILER being taken (but unsure when) — **CRIMED**

MOULTON

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

Report over concern for safety in regards to a female screaming and shouting in the street—**RESPONSE officer attended and spoke to all parties concerned—no cause for concern**

Second report in regards to concern for safety. REPORTING PERSON is in dispute with caravan owner on caravan park, solicitors are involved with the dispute.—**is a CIVIL MATTER due to the dispute—PCSO ROBERTSON will call reporting person in regards to the concern for safety.**

Report over a child not being let inside their home—**RESPONSE officers dispatched and is aware of an issue that is occurring between Child / parent and other party. Child is being told off by parent , so therefore child goes to third party, which look after him and provide for him ,what he wants. Parent has asked for third party not to get involved.**

Report of suspicious activity at a neighbours address—**has been logged and PCSO ROBERTSON will complete a reassurance check**

2nd report of child concern due to parent trying to discipline their child and third party is getting involved—**PCSO ROBERTSON has got in touch with Reporting Person to advise of what police can proceed to do.**

Report of a MALE possible trying to get access to reporting persons property— **RESPONSE officers have spoken to the reporting person. There was no damage to property and male DID NOT get into the building. Footage has been passed over to officers and reviewed , possibly the male was intoxicated and trying to find his way home. PCSO ROBERTSON will contact reporting person when back on duty.**

Report of a possible break in—**REPOSE officers dispatched and area searched no trace of anything concerning and no evidence of break in**

Report of a male passed out in the bus stop on JACK LANE— **Reporting person has stated that the male is moving, therefore has been passed over to AMBULANCE**

WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

- More Patrols in area as there is ASB issues (**No Reports of ASB within the area**)
- Safeguarding people from social media bullying—**Safe guarding advice has been provided on our Social Media Channels and to people who bring it to our attention**

LEFTWICH

- Speed Monitoring on CLIFTON DRIVE / DUNHAM ROAD / LONDON ROAD (30MPH SECTION) and LIME AVE—**Speed Camera Sessions will be up and running soon**
- More Visibility around WOODPECKER DRIVE area / GRANVILLE ROAD area
- Extend the school parking patrols to WOODSIDE TERRACE area— **is now included in the school parking patrols**
- Issues with OFF ROAD BIKES— **Owner of the BIKE has been spoken to and warned if witnessed again, bike may be seized**
- More PATROLS around the play parks due to ASB— **CCTV is now in place and no new issues since last newsletter (SEPT)**
- More patrols around the shops due to ASB issues - **CLIFTON DRIVE IS NOW CLASSED AS A HOTSPOT DUE TO ISSUES THAT HAVE BEEN REPORTED AND PATROLS ARE NOW IN PLACE WITH YOUTHS BEING ASKED TO MOVE ON**
- Leftwich building needs to be patrolled more —**Building is now up for sale and building is more secure—Feedback from residents is that issue has died down**
- Provide something for the youths to be involved in —**this is being looked into as we use to have a YOUTH CLUB operating in MOULTON but we just need a building to hold something and put something on**

KINGSMEAD

- Parking patrols on REGENCY WAY just after the ROUNDABOUT— **Parking patrols have been conducted by MINI POLICE**
- Speed Monitoring on REGENCY WAY and DUKES WAY—**Will be included in the MINI POLICE PROGRAM**
- School Parking patrols extend to MONARCH DRIVE—**Now included in the school parking patrol**
- More Patrols around REGENCY WAY RETAIL PARK
- Littering from the students that attend SIR JOHN DEANES—**this will be looked into by the MINI POLICE**
- Anti Social Behaviour issues around the community—**THERE HAS BEEN SOME ISSUES WITH ASB WHICH ARE BEING LOOKED INTO DUE TO IT BEING REPORTED TO 101**
- Parking patrols around WYNDHAM CLOSE— **Parking patrols are taking place**
- Parking near KING EDWARDS CLOSE —**Parking patrols are now taking place—one resident has been spoken to in regards to parking**
- **(OCT) PARKING ON DROPPED KERBS** around the BICKLEY CLOSE area— **Parking patrols now in place**
- **(DEC) Parking on DRIVEWAYS**, people should park on their driveways and not on the road— **PCSO Robertson will look into this in the next few weeks to see if there are obstructions caused**

- **(NOV) - Speed Monitoring on MOUNT PLEASANT / FOUNTAIN LANE / LONDON ROAD (20 MPH SECTION) / HARTFORD ROAD and CHURCH ROAD** at commuter times—**community speed watch is restarting soon—JAN**
- Provide events / things to do for the youths in the community—**Football sessions have been set up in AUGUST**
- **(NOV) More Parking patrols around the area**
- Issues with OFF ROAD BIKES / ELECTRIC SCOOTERS around JACK LANE— **No new issues since last report (SEPT)**

- (NOV) Parking Issues at the top of CHURCH ROAD / junction of LONDON ROAD— **NO NEW ISSUES since last newsletter (SEPT)**
- (NOV) Parking on LONDON ROAD and LABURNUM ROAD—**Any issues witnessed on LONDON ROAD will be issued with FIXED PENALTY TICKETS as it's the main road PCSO ROBERTSON uses to get to MOULTON. So LONDON ROAD is being patrolled. LABURNUM ROAD is a private road so parking can not be addressed.**
- Vehicle blocking / obstructing junction—PRITCHARD DRIVE— **no issues since last newsletter—2nd month running**
- (NOV) 20MPH Signage is in the wrong areas as there is a lot of speeding in the area —**We are in the process of restarting community speed watch—restarting in JANUARY**
- ASB in the MERE BANK AREA— **No issues reported to 101—2nd month running**
- (OCT) PARKING on footpaths on LONDON ROAD—**PATROLS are in place and any issues witnessed are addressed**
- (DEC) Parking on the junctions of THE PAVILLIONS / HARTFORD ROAD—**Hartford Road is being monitored and a number of vehicles have been issued with FIXED PENALTY TICKETS due to this, with the latest being issued week commencing 20th Dec**

MOULTON

- Speed Monitoring on MAIN ROAD / WHITLOW LANE—**Speed Gun sessions are restarting soon**

- More Rural crime involvement especially with the Badger sets—**Rural Crime unit issue**
