

Chairmans Report 2024/25

In 2004 we managed to carry out several successful projects, these included,

A volunteering day on 17th July 2024 to get rid of as many roadside weeds and soil debris as we could. We managed to clear most of the weeds, and may consider doing another session this year

We also upgraded, Kensington Way Park, with a multi sports surface on the field. This now provides a high-quality play area, for ball games, while still leaving the rest of the field for those wanting to walk their dogs.

We also started an orchard project to renovate the old farm orchard on St Georges field, while this is a long-term project, in year 1 debris was cleared and a bark path laid to make the orchard more accessible. We are hoping a volunteer group will help maintain the orchard going forward.

Coronet Pond overflow was successfully repaired; this is important to keep the water level at a consistent height to help the amazing wildlife in it.

The PC was delighted to come to a maintenance arrangement with CWC for the Crown roundabout, which has now had its first cut to reinstate the crown shape, this will be maintained going forward by Northwich Town Council.

We also held another successful Christmas event on 29th November.

We continued to help fund the Mini Police who, alongside our PCSO Lee Robertson won a national award for their contribution to our local community.

We welcomed a new councillor, David Herring in February, following the resignation of Mike van Gordon who moved out of the area. We'd like to thank Mike for his contributions and look forward to working with David.

And we continue to organise Litter picks on the last Sunday of the month.

We have also arranged an event for this year, which will be on 28th June with a VE day themed picnic on St George's field
